


Emaan International School Annual Report 2020-2021

Introduction

- The year of 2021 is a challenging year when all schools in Cambodia have experienced being shut down and struggled to help Students learn from a distance due to Covid-19 pandemic. EIS and other schools over Cambodia are ordered closed from March 2021 to October 2021.
- In whatever circumstances education is still the first priority for students, therefore EIS has put effort into ensuring the continuity of education for students. EIS keeps providing online lessons by posting 20 videos in a day through Facebook Messenger Group for all grades, from primary 1 to primary 5. Handouts and worksheets are also produced and collected by students from the school on a weekly basis; they then have to return the worksheet every weekend. Moreover, EIS has established a parent's support committee to communicate with parents and guardians to address issues they are facing in monitoring and supporting distance learning of their children. I as a principal together with teachers worked very hard to ensure the success of the distance learning of the students. Resulting from our effort we have successfully reached out and involved 75% of the total number of students in distance learning.


Academic Timeline






Online learning during Covi-19


