

1.Introduction

Since our founding in 2019, EIS has gone through various challenges including getting students to enrol as when our school was opened, we only had basic facilities. Despite this, EIS was steadfast in moving forward by building its relationship and network with parents and the broader community. Being guided by its community engagement plan that was premised on the strong commitment to offer quality learning and teaching, EIS was able to achieve its enrollment goal of 100 students by the beginning of 2021.

8. Educational

Programmes

a. National Curriculum (NC)

i. The objective of Grades 1-3 curriculum is to ensure that every child has a strong foundation in literacy and Mathematics with the development of health, physical, moral understanding, learning skills, and life skills. Art education (songs, drawing, dance and music) is included as part of the Science and Social Studies curriculum (Ministry of Education and Youth, MoEY's curriculum policy 2004). The amount of time allocated to each subject is 40 minutes per period.

ii. The objective of Grades 4-6 curriculum is to expand and consolidate students' knowledge and understanding of Khmer language, Mathematics, learning skills, life skills, moral, and personal development that will enable them to pursue life-long learning as well to introduce students to content in the areas of Science and Social Studies. Art education is included in Social Studies (MoEY's curriculum policy 2004).

b. English

i. Cambodian students' mastery of English language is way below the International primary level. Hence, EIS students have to be taught from the beginning levels of English. Oxford Phonics World 1 book has been selected for all grades (P1 to P4). The objective of English language subject for these levels is to give students a comprehensive introduction to the written form and sound of each letter. It focuses on the 26 letters of the English alphabet. The number of periods allocated for English language is 10 periods, 40 minutes each.

c. Islamic Studies

i. Since student's English language ability is still weak, the original Andalus Islamic Studies Book from Singapore was not suitable for them. Therefore the alternative way is to teach them the basic Arabic alphabets (Iqra') for the first 3 terms (Term 1 to Term 3) and by the Fourth Term, they are taught the Khmer version of the Andalus Singapore book translated by Emaan Foundation Cambodia (EFC). Considering the limited learning ability of the students in Primary 1 and Primary 2, only two Islamic studies subjects (Quran and Aqidah,) have been allocated for both grades. Whereas, there are five subjects in Primary 3 and Primary 4: Quran, Aqidah, Figh, Akhlaq and Arabic. The number of periods allocated for Islamic Studies is 5 periods, 40 minutes each.

d. Enrichment program

i. At EIS we believe that it is important for children to have the broadest possible opportunities to explore new activities to expand their skills, develop self-confidence, and discover new hobbies and passions. We offer a number of programs led both by our own teaching staff and by external specialist coaches. In 2019, two programs have been carried out by volunteers from Singapore, the Kids Athletics Carnival (8th December 2019) and the Storytelling Carnival (20th December 2019). In 2020, no enrichment programs were carried out due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

c. Objective

- 1. To ensure that students continue to learn during the school closure period
- 2. To raise students' awareness that school closure due to Covid-19 is not considered a school holiday, They have to continue learning at home.
- 3. Maintain the school-parents relationship.

d. Execution Procedure

- . Online learning is implemented through Facebook and Google Meet.
- **2**. Live lessons are directly live on FB closed group.
- **3**. There are 4 subjects offered namely: Khmer language, English language, Khmer Maths, and Islamic Studies.
- **4**. The duration for each session is 15 to 20 minutes.
- **5**. The online class is carried on 5 days a week.
- 6. Those students who have no smartphone or internet connectivity are given the alternative to come to school for homework collection and teachers will do a short presentation on the lesson. About 30% of the students are among this group.

- 7. 20 videos of the lesson are posted daily
- 8. Homework for each subject is released once a week every Friday. The teachers who are responsible for creating homework have to make sure that the homework is released in their own groups in the afternoon. The deadline is on Wednesday the week after releasing. The teachers mark the homework, record it and use it as a monthly average to rank the students.

e. Challenges

Despite the efforts made by the school in facilitating online learning about 40% of students still not fully participate in Online class for the following reasons:

- 1. Poor time management: Being at home and without assistance from parents students are too free that make them fail to manage their time properly for online class.
- 2. Lack of motivation: Students need to socialize with their friends but online class makes them socially isolated, therefore they are not highly motivated to learn.
- 3. Too much flexibility: Students feel that studying online they can study at any time so they keep on procrastinating. By doing so students are unable to commit to their study schedule set by the teachers and submit their homework on time.

f. Solution

In response to the challenges that EIS is facing, some solution have been proposed:

- 1. Time management: Create parents support groups in order to communicate regularly with parents to assist parents on how to help manage their children's time.
- 2. Motivate students to learn:
 - a. Award certificate of appreciation for students who are actively involved in online learning.
 - b. Vary the formats of content: it could be videos, lesson summary, and worksheet.

- c. Form a community of students who stay in the same area and ask them to study together in a small group of less than 10 people with supervision from their parents. Engagement goes up when students feel like they're a part of a group.
- d. Weekly video release on EIS social media pages of the interview with top students and their parents sharing experience and tips on how to study online effectively
- e. Flexibility: set deadlines for each module and send reminders when the deadline is close.




